The Childhood/TESOL Master of Science in Education Degree Program at Canisius is designed for those dedicated to meet the needs of General Education Students and especially English Language Learners. This program places a strong emphasis on theory, research and practical experience. The curriculum enables candidates to develop an understanding of etiology, related psychological and social factors and techniques proven effective for teaching students with diverse learning needs.

This program combines the Childhood (1-6) program with the Teaching English as a Second or Other Language (K-12) program to prepare new candidates to gain initial and professional certification in *Childhood Education (Grades 1-6) and TESOL (Grades K-12)*. Please note that most of the Childhood courses are face to face, but all of the TESOL courses are taught fully online and asynchronously.

Grade Requirements

Graduate students seeking endorsement from Canisius University for certification must achieve a C or above in all program coursework and a 3.0 or above overall GPA. Failure to meet this requirement will require repeating the course and/or completing additional coursework.

Residency Program

This program may be completed through a traditional or residency pathway. Both pathways include scaffolded field experiences, but the traditional pathway culminates in two, seven-week student teaching placements while a full year paid residency is the culminating experience for the residency pathway.
